LONDON MEETING, 10-12 OCTOBER 1989

Dear Don

Thanks to the assistance of one of my colleagues in a London IBM office, the administrative details have now been arranged for this meeting.

HOTEL

12 single rooms with bath have been provisionally booked at the Strand Palace hotel for arrival 9th October and departure 12th October. Working Group members should book individually before the cut off date of Friday 22 September, and if they quote the booking reference number of 9300, they will have the rooms at the favourable IBM rate of 57 pounds sterling per night.

If members require something different, such as a double room (IBM rate 73 pounds), they should contact the hotel as soon as possible, quote the reference number, and state their requirements.

As you said you did not expect more than 12 attendees, I have obtained 12 copies of the hotel brochure (apart from one for yourself) for you to send out.

TRAVEL

The cheapest way of getting to the hotel from Heathrow Airport would be Underground train from Heathrow to Trafalgar Square. You can then walk to the hotel. An alternative would be to take the airline bus to the London terminal and then a taxi to the hotel. A taxi all the way from the airport would be convenient but very expensive. If anybody must hire a car they will find it expensive and difficult to park in central London and please remember, we drive on the left in the UK! I would not recommend hiring a car.

MEETING

I have booked Room GC7 for the three days of the meeting, 10-12th October, and this is at IBM's South Bank offices at 76-78, Upper Ground,

12 June 1989

London. The map on the back of the hotel brochure shows the National Theatre, the IBM office is next door to this theatre, and a short walk over the River Thames from the hotel.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Nearer the date of the meeting I hope to gather some information leaflets about London and what is going on in October. If members can copy me when they book the hotel I will send out these leaflets to the non-British attendees.

British weather in October is variable. Sometimes we get an "Indian summer", a late heat wave, but members should be prepared for cooler weather and, of course, the occasional shower.

I think that covers everything at the moment, but if anybody has any questions or concerns I will be happy to help. See you on the evening of the 9th Oct in the hotel, when I will buy you a pint of our British speciality, warm real ale!
