STATUS: This liaison statement has been produced by the SGFS at its authorized Sub-group meeting held in London in December 1992.

1. SGFS POSITION ON JTC 1 N 2128 (SGFS N 703)

The SGFS has reviewed the liaison statement from the JTC1 SWG-RA contained in JTC1 N 2128 and appreciates the changes that have been made to the JTC1 Directives as documented in section 2 of N 2128. SGFS confirms that the proposed working method as documented in sections 3 and 4 is acceptable to the SGFS and that this approach will be adopted immediately.

2. SPECIFIC COMMENTS ON JTC 1 N 2128

a) Specific revisions to the SGFS procedures have been agreed which will require a PDISP submitter to clearly indicate if a proposed ISP is intended to perform the act of registration of objects in one or more parts and to provide an explanation of the need. When the SGFS secretariat receives such a PDISP, a copy of it will be forwarded to the SWG-RA along with its explanatory report which contains the justification. These provisions, combined with the review process which is carried out in the SGFS on PDISPs, should cover points 4 a) - c) in JTC 1 N 2128. A revised copy of the SGFS procedures is also being forwarded to the SWG-RA.

b) The SGFS considers that additional text to cover the registration process in ISPs may well be required in TR 10000-1 and will review this topic at its next meeting.

c) As far as modifications to other documents are concerned, as mentioned in sections 5 a) and b) of JTC 1 N 2128, SGFS will continue to review this topic, and any future updates would be targeted to fit in with the recently agreed 27-month update cycle of the JTC1 Directives.
