Directions from the airport by car:

When you exit the airport, you will be on Peña Boulevard. Follow Peña Boulevard about 10 miles to Interstate 70. Take I-70 West to I-270 West, which becomes US 36 West to Boulder. Take the Louisville exit and turn right. You will be on McCaslin Boulevard. Stay in the far right lane. In less than a block, you will see a Courtyard by Marriott sign, where you turn right. Go behind the first row of buildings and you will see the hotel.

By shuttle:

Super Shuttle, \$25 each way, http://www.supershuttle.com .

By public transportation:

Buy a ticket on the AB bus to Louisville (pronounced Louis-ville, not like the one in Kentucky) at the RTD desk in the airport terminal. The fare is \$12 each way or \$22 round trip. Get off at McCaslin Park & Ride in Louisville, which is the last stop before Boulder. Cross the street and walk north (the mountains are to the west). In less than a block, you will see the Courtyard by Marriott sign. Follow it behind the first row of buildings to the hotel. To return to the airport, walk to the south side of the bridge across US 36 to catch the AB bus.

A car is not necessary. There are several restaurants within easy walking distance of the hotel. The grocery store is two blocks north of the hotel. Also, the B bus can take you from the McCaslin Park & Ride to the Pearl Street Mall in downtown Boulder for \$3.50.

Breakfast pastries will be available in the meeting room, Salon A&B.

Restaurants in Louisville are north and south along McCaslin Boulevard where you came in, and in the shopping area north of the hotel.

The largest collection of restaurants is in downtown Boulder on and around the Pearl Street Mall. There is a wide variety of cuisine. One of my favorites is the Boulder Cafe at Pearl and 13th, with light, often inventive fare. Between 11th Street and 15th Street, Pearl Street is pedestrian only.

There are also several restaurants on and near the 29th Street Mall, which is between Arapahoe and Pearl Street in Boulder. At Pearl and 28th is Turley's, a Boulder institution, with a large vegetarian menu.
