: Liaison Statement on Standardization of Profile Test Specifications

held in Seoul, 5 - 9 July 1993.

Note

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SGFS has discussed the subject of Standardization of Profile Test Specifications at its Authorized Subgroup Meeting held 8 - 11 December 1992. It is our intent to modify our procedures document, SD-1 "Taxonomy Update, ISP Approval, & Maintenance Process" at our meeting scheduled for Seoul, 5 - 9 July 1993. We request comments on the following principles which are a result of our December meeting.

1) The role of SGFS in the PTS process:

The role of SGFS for PTSs is similar to the role the SGFS has for profiles:

- a) The SGFS will create an environment which allows for the submission of (preferably) harmonized draft PTSs as PDISPs, and their progression towards publication as ISPs.
- b) The SGFS will expand its Framework and Procedures documents to allow for the above responsibility, as well as for the update and maintenance of approved PTSs.
- c) The SGFS will rely on other parties
 - to generate and maintain the ATS definitions of the base standards, and
 - ii) to create the draft PTSs.

Assignment of Responsibilities

SGFS re-asserts that:


- a) Base standards groups have responsibility for standardizing Abstract Test Suites for base standards.
- b) SGFS has responsibility for standardizing Profile Test Specifications.
- c) If a PTS is submitted to SGFS which has no corresponding ATS, SGFS will suspend processing of the PTS until the ATS has progressed sufficiently. See also 4) below.
- 3) Standardization of "Partial ATSs"

SGFS foresees a definite need to standardize "partial ATSs".

that is, ATSs which correspond to a subset of the functionality of the base standard. Such a subset would correspond to the functionality of a profile. SGFS would like SC21/WG1 Conformance to confirm that this is permitted by ISO/IEC 9646.

4) PTS Approval Process within SGFS

SGFS expects to adopt a PTS approval process based on the following:



5) Method of Packaging Profile Testing Material

DIS 9646-6, Clause 10.5, describes two method of packaging profile testing material, depending on whether the profile specification document addresses one profile or multiple profiles.

SGFS would like to inform SC21/WG1 Conformance that the latter situation (as ISP documenting multiple profiles) is by far the normal occurrence, and that the parts of such an ISP are developed in an on-going manner over a period of time. (ISPs exist which have nearly 50 parts already planned.) We believe that intermingling parts related to testing within such a document may lead to confusion.

We therefore suggest that Clause 10.5 of 9646-6 be reworded to allow flexibility in packaging profile-related material. Specifically, we request that the possibility of creating a separate testing standard for profiles is explicitly mentioned. This approach of using a separate standard would align with the approach currently used for documenting test specifications for base standards.
