RESOLUTIONS 9TH RWS-CC MEETING - 27, 28 APRIL 1993 - CANNES

- The RWS-CC requests the RWSs to verify the SGFS SD-5 on S-liaisons and to report any inconsistencies to the RWS-CC Chair.
- The RWS-CC encourages the RWSs to make available final ISP-texts on-line noting that their availability is for development and maintenance only. A standard clause which clarifies this purpose will be added to the online versions.
- The RWS-CC asks its chair to send a letter to ISO expressing the RWSs' intent to
 include copyright waivers on Profile ICS Proformas and other types of proformas
 for conformance statements in a similar way to base standards PICS proformas.
- 4. The RWS-CC urges the RWSs to maintain an electronic archive of submitted ISPs, in order to facilitate maintenance and change of editors.
- 5. The RWS-CC, considering some recent problems with regard to the informal review process and observing that the combination of an informal review with a regular JTC1/SC-meeting has proved to be very efficient in the past, would like to remind its editors of this possibility.
- 6. The RWS-CC asks its chair to send a letter to the SGFS secretariat requesting the latest update of SGFS SD-3 which lists the informal reviewers. It is recommended that the reviewers receive the pDISP text directly through the editor provided the text is accompanied by an explanatory cover letter.
- The RWS-CC notes the EWOS interest in work on CGM-profiles and asks EWOS
 to present a formal proposal at the next RWS-CC meeting.
- 8. The RWS-CC agrees that, awaiting possible further developments with regard to CGM, the current scope of PAGODA remains unchanged.
- 9. The RWS-CC requests that the AOM2x taxonomy be sent only for information to SGFS, as soon as it is approved by EWOS/TA. The taxonomy will be accompanied by a letter to clarify that the formal submission of the taxonomy for ballot will take place together with the pDISP submission.
- 10. The RWS-CC asks the joint group on DFR to propose a work programme for evaluation at the next RWS-CC meeting. The RWSs are asked to give a statement from their plenaries with regard to the progression of the work on DFR at the next RWS-CC meeting.

- 11. The RWS-CC agrees to convene under its auspices a series of Ad Hoc meetings to begin the process of coordinating PTS production, associated QA assurance and the process for submitting these to formal standardisation.
 - A first coordinating meeting will be organised by OIW on 10 June 1993 at its next Workshop. This meeting is requested to report to the next RWS-CC on its proposed plans for the way forward.
- 12. The RWS-CC approves RWS-TR 000, accepting the ETSI request to be mentioned together with EWOS for joint EWOS/ETSI activities.
- 13. The RWS-CC approves RWS-TR 001 after considering some final editorial comments by AOW.
- 14. The RWS-CC agrees to send RWS-TR 001 to SGFS in response to SGFS N755.
- 15. The RWS-CC approves that the following RWS-TRs be developed:

FTAM Concurrency Control
Coded Character Set environment based on ISO 2022
Coded Character Set environment based on ISO 10646
Conformance Testing Vocabulary
TTCN Style Guide
Library of Test Specifications
PCTR and SCTR Proformas
Framework for Conformance and Testing of Network Management Profiles
Object Identifiers in ISPs

- 16. The RWS-CC requests the RWSs to consider developing a set of ISPs in the domain of Character Sets and to discuss their views by liaison statements in preparation for a decision at the next RWS-CC meeting.
- 17. The RWS-CC asks MISG to coordinate the resolution of the technical problems related to FDI2
- 18. The RWS-CC requests the RWSs to review the proposed taxonomy for TP use of the Directory and, if possible, to respond with a statement of harmonisation to permit submission to SGFS in July.
- 19. The RWS-CC requests AOW to consider starting activity in the RDA domain and to report back by the next RWS-CC meeting.
- 20. The RWS-CC gladly accepts the offer of the OIW Chair to prepare a summary document of working taxonomies to compliment the published TR10000 taxonomy which may lag behind the current RWS-CC work programme.

- 21. The RWS-CC asks EWOS to forward an initial draft of a register of Object Identifiers defined in ISPs to AOW and OIW for comment and discussion at the next RWS-CC meeting.
- 22. The RWS-CC agrees on the revised RWS-CC Programme of Work as in RWS-SD 1. The RWS-CC accepts the offer by the EWOS Secretariat to maintain RWS-SD 1 on behalf of RWS-CC.
- 23. The 10th meeting of the RWS-CC will be held on 13-14 October 1993 in Japan, hosted by AOW
- 24. The tentative schedule for the 11th meeting is 10-11 March 1994, in USA hosted by OIW.
- 25. The RWS-CC Chair for the forthcoming term will be Mr. T. Landberg, OIW Chair. The RWS-CC thanks Dr. Black who has been chairing over the last year for his excellent job.
- 26. The RWS-CC thanks EWOS for hosting the 9th meeting. In particular, the RWS-CC thanks Mrs. Valet-Harper and Mrs. Santerne for taking good care of all meeting arrangements.
